



The students who are **eligible** for the apprenticeship ¹ are required to follow the instructions given below:

01. After the results are released, the eligible student must complete, under Rule 36 of the Rules of the Incorporated Council of Legal Education, a six-month apprenticeship under an Attorney-at-Law of **eight years** standing.
02. The apprentice must submit his/her Letter of Commencement (see Annexure 1) issued by the said Attorney to the Apprenticeship Unit, Sri Lanka Law College, within the submission period specified in the "**Notice to Students Qualified for the Apprenticeship Programme.**" published under the **Notices** section of the Sri Lanka Law College website.
03. The Letter of Commencement will not be accepted for any reason after the date and time specified in the "**Notice to Students Qualified for the Apprenticeship Programme**"
04. The apprentice must complete his/her apprenticeship in Sri Lanka.
05. The apprentice must complete the Practical Training Course conducted by the Sri Lanka Law College.
06. After completing four (4) months of apprenticeship the apprentice must:
 - (a) check the correctness of his/her full name with the given name in the pass list² before submitting the Notice of Enrolment³ (see Annexure 2).
 - (b) hand over two copies of the Notice of Enrolment to the Registrar of the Supreme Court.
 - (c) hand over the Notice of Enrolment to the Government Press and to a Newspaper for publication within two (2) working days from the submission date of the Notice of Enrolment to the Registrar of the Supreme Court.
 - (d) hand over two copies of the Notice of Enrolment to the Apprenticeship Unit of Sri Lanka Law College with the covering letter (see Annexure 4) within two (2) working days from the submission date of the Notice of Enrolment to the Government Press.

(Note that the four sets of the same copies of Enrolment Notice should be printed.)

³⁶ After passing the Final Examination for the admission of Attorneys-at-Law a student shall in accordance with the Regulations in Schedule III, attend for a period of six months the chambers of an Attorney-at-Law of 8 years standing practicing in Sri Lanka and familiarise himself with the ordinary business of an Attorney-at-Law and shall also attend such Practical Training Course as may be prescribed by the Council. Provided that where, in the case of an Attorney-at-Law student, the Council is satisfied that the student has in a judicial capacity acquired sufficient practical acquaintance with the Principles of Legal procedure, it may dispense with the requirements of the rule.

³ The students who have registered in Sri Lanka Law College under Rule 51 of the Rules of the Incorporated Council of Legal Education, must complete their examinations before submitting the Notice of Enrolment.

7. After completing the Apprenticeship and six weeks after publishing the Notice of Enrolment in the Gazette, the following documents must be handed over to the Apprenticeship Unit of Sri Lanka Law College by the apprentice himself/herself on a date to be announced on the Sri Lanka Law College Website.
- (a) Original and a photocopy of the letter of Termination (see annexure 3) issued by the Attorney who issued the Letter of Commencement.
 - (b) Copy of the Gazette Notification.
 - (c) Deed Book Submission Certificate (If applicable).
 - (d) Student Identity Card.
 - (e) Relevant set of forms (refer to No. 9 below)
8. The Apprenticeship Unit of the Sri Lanka Law College will release the following documents to the apprentice on the same day specified in No.7 above.
- (a) Preliminary Year Examination Certificate
 - (b) Intermediate Year Examination Certificate
 - (c) Final Year Examination Certificate
 - (d) Practical Training Course Certificate
 - (e) A copy of the Notice of Enrolment signed by the Registrar, Council of Legal Education
9. The apprentice must download the relevant set of forms required for uploading to the Supreme Court Portal. The relevant set of forms must include the Application, the Affidavit, and the Schedule. The apprentice shall duly complete all the forms before uploading them to the Supreme Court Portal.
